4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand that sometimes we make assumptions based on what people look like and to understand what influences these assumptions. 	<i>character, assumption, judgement, surprised, different, appearance, accept,</i>

6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand that there are different perceptions of what normal means, 	<i>normal, ability, disability, visual impairment, empathy, perception, vision, blind, prejudice, discrimination</i>
