How to Prepare for the Trip

- Please make payment via Parent Pay
- All children will need a packed lunch for the day. If your child usually has a school dinner, they will be given a packed lunch from the school kitchen. Please let us know if you will be providing your child with a packed lunch from home instead.
- Your child should come to school in school uniform as normal. We will be walking between the Air Raid Shelters therefore a coat is essential.
- The children are going to wear a 'gas mask box' since they will be in role as evacuees. Please provide your child with a brown box around the size of a shoe box or smaller ready for the first day back on Monday 24th February. We will attach the string and add any details as necessary.

- To keep with the theme of World War, if you would like to provide your child with a 'rationed' lunch, here are some ideas (however this is not an expectation):

Ration Lunch Ideas

- Wholemeal bread
 - Sandwich fillings: cheese, Spam, luncheon meat, corned beef, sardines, Meat or fish paste, salad.
 - British grown fruit in season e.g. apples, pears, plums, peaches, cherries etc
 - Plain biscuits e.g. rich tea or custard creams
 - Home-made cakes (sorry, probably not chocolate!)
 - Sandwiches wrapped in greaseproof paper (baking parchment is a good substitute)
 - Milk, squash, or water
 - Salt and Shake crisps
- We will be leaving school as close to 9am as possible and returning to school for 3.15pm. Please ensure that your child arrives at school on time.

From experience, the trip is going to be a great way for the children to develop their understanding of what life would have been like during the War.
